Just after half-term, we held the first ever 'Wessex MAT Music Festival', where 160 students took part in a variety of workshops and performances. At the end of February, we held our annual 'Year 4 Concerts' (3 concerts, 450 children!) and just last week we hosted a wonderful Musical Theatre workshop with visiting professionals from the West End.

It has been wonderful to see so many young people enjoying performing this term and equally wonderful to see such supportive audiences! Read on to find out what we have planned for the rest of the year....

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Wessex MAT Music Festival



In February we held the inaugural 'Wessex MAT Music Festival'. This day included 5 schools (Thomas Hardye, St Osmund's, Dorchester Middle, St Mary's Middle and Purbeck Secondary) with students from years 5-12 taking part. The day consisted of a body-percussion warm-up session, followed by three different workshops; orchestra, choir and rock band, with about 60 students in each group. At the end of the day, all of the students performed to each other and there was also the opportunity to hear some of the more established THS ensembles.

The orchestra focussed on the piece A Night on the Bare Mountain by Mussorgsky. The choir learnt an acapella version of Duffy's Mercy and a 3-part harmony version of Fix You by Cold Play. The Rock bands focussed on learning Green Onions and Wipeout, and did some work on improvisation. For some of the students, it was the first time that they had had the opportunity to work with such a large group of musicians before. It was wonderful to see students from across the five schools working together and supporting each other so well. We very much hope this is the start of an annual event! Year 4 Concerts



At the end of February, we held our annual Year 4 concerts. 450 children came together, from all 14 DASP first/primary schools, over 3 nights to perform for family and friends, at The Thomas Hardye School Theatre. As mentioned previously, this was the first time we have been able to run this project 'as normal' since Covid, and it was really lovely to see all the Year 4s back in the Hardye Theatre. This year, the theme of the concerts was 'Peace and Friendship'. Songs included Can You Feel the Love Tonight from the Lion King, One and a Million and Ed Sheeran's What do I Know. The concerts formed the showcase finale of weeks of hard work by the students. Mrs Trevorrow had visited each school, three times, over the preceding 6 weeks and worked with the children on learning the songs. Thanks to all of the teachers and parents who worked with the children to make the concerts such a great success. 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Gabrieli Roar



On 29th November, 85 students from Thomas Hardye and the three middle schools took part in a spectacular performance at Portsmouth Cathedral as part of the Gabrieli Roar project. The project involved 3,000 young singers participating in eight performances across the country, alongside the Gabrieli Consort's world-class musicians. The concert, entitled 'In Dulci Jubilo', was a Christmastide treat featuring the spectacular flamboyant polychoral music of Michael Praetorius in belated celebration of the 400th anniversary of the great composer's death. The students all performed magnificently and it was a wonderful opportunity to experience working with these professional musicians up-close.

Musical Theatre Workshop



On 6th March, we were lucky enough to be visited by four visiting professional Musical Theatre actors. The professionals worked with 140 students from across 6 schools throughout the day and then performed with the students in an evening show for parents. Throughout the day, the students rehearsed six numbers, complete with choreography. Several students also had the opportunity to work 1:1 with the professionals to gain some input on solo and duet work. It was a very tiring day, but the amount that the students achieved was phenomenal.
