Applications are now open for our new Young Musician Festival that we will be holding on Saturday 25th November. The Festival is open to all students of approximately grade 4 standard and above and will provide performance and feedback opportunities for students in a



friendly and supportive environment. Students will perform in classes during the day to the adjudicators and a small audience. Some students will then be invited back to perform at the festival evening concert, which will also feature a performance by the Thomas Hardye Concert Band. This is a great way to get solo performance experience, without the stress of it being in exam conditions!

The online application form can be found on our website and the closing date for applications is Friday 20th October. We are very much hoping that students will enjoy getting involved in this event and help to make this venture a success, which can then continue as a permanent feature of the DASP Music calendar.

Colourstrings Music Classes underway



September saw the start of our new Colourstrings music sessions for Key Stage 1 children. These classes are taking place on a Wednesday from 4.30pm onwards at Damers school. Classes are taught by Jo Pires (BA hons Music; PGCE; Trinity College of Music, London). Teaching is child-centred, building on each child's existing understanding. Children sing, listen & have fun in a warm & positive environment, barely aware of the enormous amount they are learning in a sensitive,

Singing Strategy Funding

Once again, we have been awarded funding from the Dorset Music Education Hub from the National Singing Strategy. Over the past few years we have done several projects with this money, including the ACM Gospel Choir workshop and the Musical Theatre workshop with professionals from London's West End.

This year, we are going to fund Steve Wilson to run rock band workshops at each of the three middle schools and fund two music specialists to spend some time at each of the first schools, primarily working with year 2 and year 4.
