The two pieces were performed to family and friends at the end of the day and were also performed at the Summer Concert at the Weymouth Pavilion a few weeks later.

## DASP Young Musician Festival 2018-19



We are going to be running our Young Musician Festival again this academic year on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> January 2019 at The Thomas Hardye School.

The main emphasis of the festival will be on all participants taking part and gaining valuable feedback from our adjudicators (one of whom is an ABRSM examiner). This will be particularly useful for any students who are taking GCSE or A level music or who are soon to take an external exam.

Anyone who plays an orchestral instrument or piano of grade 3 standard and above is invited to apply.

Classes will run during the day, from 10am – 4.30pm, for each of the individual categories. In the evening, some students will be invited back as finalists to perform at the evening concert at 7.30pm at The Thomas Hardye School Theatre.

The closing date for applications is **Friday 7<sup>th</sup> December.**
